Strawberry Farms Restoration Site





Background

Acquired by the Foothill/Eastern Transportation Corridor Agency (F/ETCA) in 2010, the Strawberry Farms restoration site is located within the 360-acre Quail Hill Preserve in Irvine. F/ETCA has restored and enhanced coastal sage scrub, cactus scrub and native perennial grassland to establish a mosaic of habitat for native species, including the federally listed coastal California gnatcatcher and coastal cactus wren.

Current Activities

Strawberry Farms Restoration Site is resilient and self-sustaining.

Species

From birds to butterflies, Strawberry Farms is home to many species. More than 100 plant and animal species have been observed at the site. Some of the wildlife that can be found at the site are:
