3 EASY WAYS TO PAY



FasTrak®

Pay with a transponder. Drivers choosing this option enjoy lower tolls (\$1 less per toll point) and can use the transponder on toll roads, lanes and bridges throughout the state. Drivers are issued a transponder and pay tolls automatically from a pre-established account that can be prepaid and replenished using credit card, cash or check.



ExpressAccount®

No transponder is required for drivers who choose this option for use only on the 73, 133, 241 and 261 Toll Roads. A photo of your car's license plate is scanned and connected to the account you set up.



Online Payment

This is an ideal option for one-time users. Simply go online within five days of using the 73, 133, 241 or 261 Toll Roads and enter your license plate number and pay. We also offer a mobile app for payment. There are no invoices, prepayments, statements or transponders.

CLASSIC WAY TO PAY

Drivers can choose to pay in person at our **Customer Service Center in Irvine** using cash, a check, an electronic check or a credit card.



GO MOBILE

Download the **FREE app** for Google Play and Apple devices. Sign up, review toll activity, manage your account and pay a toll within five days from your smart phone or tablet! Phone challenged? All of these actions can be performed online at **TheTollRoads.com**.

LET'S TALK...

Q. I carpool. Does that mean I get a discount?

A.

The Toll Roads were designed for all drivers to get to their destination as quickly as possible. As such, all drivers — whether they carpool, or drive hybrid or electric cars — pay the same tolls. Consider asking your carpool buddies to split the toll.

Q. I drive a motorcycle, do I have to pay a toll? Can I use FasTrak?

A.

Motorcycles pay the same toll as every two-axle vehicle on The Toll Roads. Motorcyclists can use FasTrak, and ExpressAccount or pay online. If you pay with FasTrak, be sure to keep the transponder in a secure location, such as in a pocket or bag.



OPT IN. DRIVE. GET REWARDED.

FasTrak® and **ExpressAccount®** members who drive The Toll Roads at least once during the month are eligible for monthly deals ranging from restaurants to theme parks and whale-watching excursions to lift ticket discounts at local mountain resorts. JUST BOUGHT A NEW CAR?

In order to drive The Toll Roads, a vehicle without a license plate must pay using **FasTrak®** and have a transponder properly mounted to the windshield. It is illegal to drive The Toll Roads in a vehicle that has no license plates and no FasTrak transponder.

VISITING O.C. FOR A SPELL?

Pay Online - This is an ideal option for visitors, tourists and business travelers. Go online within five days of using The Toll Roads, enter your license plate number and pay for your trips.
